My top summer novels

Are you going on holiday soon and looking for that perfect summer read? Here are some of my recommendations to keep you occupied this summer.

***The Perks of Being a Wallflower* by Stephen Chbosky**

This coming-of-age novel was published in 1999 and is set in Pittsburgh, USA, in the early 90's. The story's narrator is an introverted teenager, Charlie. He describes different life events through letters he sends to a stranger as a form of therapy. The story follows his progression from a shy and socially awkward boy, a wallflower, on his first day of high school, to a social butterfly. Along the way Charlie navigates through the world of first dates, family dramas and new friends. Many teenagers can relate to this rollercoaster ride of growing up.

***The Book Thief* by Markus Zusak**

Published in 2006, this historical novel has won lots of awards. It's set in Germany in World War II and tells the story of a foster girl, Liesel Meminger, whose parents were taken away to a concentration camp. Liesel steals books and shares them with her foster family and the residents of her street. Both Liesel and her neighbours find themselves being changed by the words in the books and by the terrible events around them. I'm reading this book at the moment – and I'm enjoying it!

***The Hound of the Baskervilles* by Arthur Conan Doyle**

This is a must-read for people who love crime novels. The classic story was first published in 1902. It is set in Devon, in England, and tells the story of a mysterious murder that local people fear was by a terrifying supernatural hound. It features well-known detective Sherlock Holmes and his companion Doctor Watson as they investigate the case. A UK poll named it one of the most loved books of all time.
