

1. Solo instrument accompanied by an orchestra.

2. Period of music between 1600 and 1750. Harpsichord was a common instrument during this period.

3. A solo song from an Opera, can be sung by male or female.

4. A Scottish song which tells a story.

5. Scottish song sung by women, you can hear a thud in the background while they work the tweed.

6. Unaccompanied songs with Gaelic or nonsense words.

7. Solo bagpipe, usually slow and in Theme and Variation Form.

8. Music developed from spirituals and work songs. Usually in 4/4 time with a 12 bar structure.

9. Play which has speaking, singing and dancing and is performed on a stage.

10. Style of dance music with a strongly syncopated melody and usually played on piano.
