Work-related Idioms List - Definitions

1. Hit the ground running

To start a job or activity and begin working with energy and enthusiasm right away.

Example: I want to hit the ground running on my first day at work.

2. Pull your weight

To do your part in a group or team task.

Example: Everyone in the team must pull their weight to finish the project.

3. Burn the midnight oil

To work late into the night, usually studying or working hard.

Example: She burned the midnight oil to finish her report before the deadline.

4. Get the ball rolling

To start something, especially a project or activity.

Example: Let's get the ball rolling on this new campaign.

5. On the same page

To agree or have the same opinion about something.

Example: Before we begin, we need to make sure we're all on the same page.

6. Think outside the box

To think creatively or in an unusual way to solve a problem.

Example: To solve this problem, we need to think outside the box.

7. Step up to the plate

To take responsibility and do what needs to be done.

Example: When the manager was sick, Maria stepped up to the plate and led the team.

8. Take the bull by the horns

To face a difficult situation bravely and take control.

Example: He took the bull by the horns and fixed the problem himself.

9. Go the extra mile

To do more than what is expected or required.

Example: She always goes the extra mile to help her coworkers.
