## Like + (verb + -ing)

After *like, don't like, hate, love*, we use verb + -ing. Spelling rules for the -ing form:

Infinitive	Verb + -ing	Spelling
work	I like working.	add -ing
talk	She doesn't like talking.	
dance	We love dancing.	e + -ing
