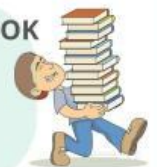

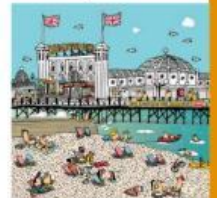

- Scientist: By the end of next year, I will have been researching this topic for two years.
