




Between 1950 and 2010, the seabird population declined 67% due to plastic pollution



Plastic debris in the ocean has contributed to the formation of close to 500 dead zones (areas of water so starved of oxygen that most marine life cannot survive there) covering more than 245,000 km² globally, equivalent to the surface of the United Kingdom.



8,000,000 tons
of plastic are dumped into the world's ocean every year, and the majority of the waste comes from these 5 countries:



22% of cetaceans, 44% of seabirds, all sea turtle species, and a growing list of fish species have been documented with plastic in and around their bodies
