In the U.S., over 80 percent of teenagers today have mobile phones, most of which are smartphones. While smartphones can be great to communicate with others, they can also lead to **behavioral** problems at school. Should students be allowed to use mobile phones at school?

Mobile Phones Should Be Banned at Schools

To start, students do not need mobile phones at school. Mobile phones **enable** students to make phone calls, to send text messages, and to use the Internet.

During class time, having phones will just distract the students. If students need to make a phone call, they can use one of the school's phones. Furthermore, smartphones could lead to cheating. With the Internet, students can easily search for answers during tests. This is **obviously** a problem. Since teachers cannot stop students from cheating all the time if they have smartphones, the best solution is to ban mobile phones altogether.



Mobile Phones Should Not Be Banned at Schools

To start, a **ban** takes away students' rights to use their phones. Mobile phones are common and important tools around the world today. Students should be able to use their phones when they need to. So schools should not ban them or take them away. Furthermore, schools can make rules for the use of mobile phones, such as only allowing their use during breaks. These rules can make students more responsible and give them a chance to learn self-control. By banning mobile phones completely, schools deny students the **opportunity** to learn how to use their mobile phones properly.
