Indirect speech

Prince : Where are you going?
 Cinderella: The fairy **told me to** go home before twelve o'clock.
 Prince : Why are you running?
 Cinderella: She **told me not to** be late!



When we use **indirect speech**, we tell what someone said but we don't use the same words. There are no quotation marks.

Dad said to me, 'Turn off the TV.'
 Dad **told me to** turn off the TV.

Mum said to Fay, 'Don't cry.'
 Mum **told Fay not to** cry.
