
Youngest girl on the Tallest mountain

Last weekend I went hiking in Tai Mo Shan Country Park — from the visitor centre up the 957-metre-high mountain. The views at the top were fantastic. I was proud of my climb, but then I heard about an Indian girl called Malavath Poorna. In May 2014 she became the youngest girl to climb Mount Everest, the world's tallest mountain. She was only 13 years and 11 months!

Mala comes from a poor family in India. Her parents both work on a farm and together earn 3,000 rupees (about HK\$350) a month. They work hard to send Mala and her siblings to school. Mala started climbing mountains in India and found that she really enjoyed it and was good at it. That is when she decided to climb Everest.

Mala's journey from base camp to the top of Mount Everest took almost seven weeks. She said that at first she was afraid but she never thought about giving up. The hardest thing during her climb was 'eating packed food'. She said the smell made her feel sick and she missed her mum's cooking! But it was worth it when she raised the Indian flag at the top. Nothing could beat that wonderful feeling.

Mala wants to be a role model and show other poor young Indians that they can do great things. I think she is amazing and although I may never climb Mount Everest, I hope to be brave and strong like her.
