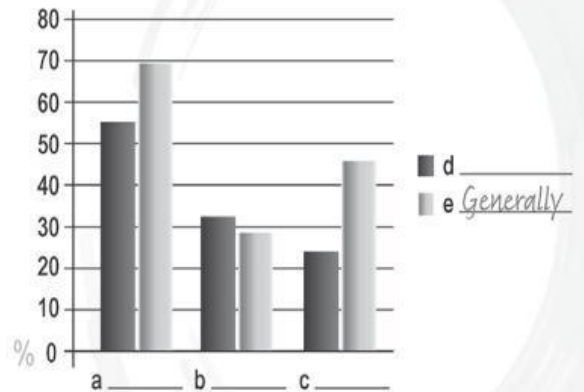

Newspaper circulation is declining, and now more people get their news on the Internet than ever before. In a recent survey we asked commuters on the morning train two questions: "Where do you generally get your news?" and "If you saw the news today, what format was it in?".

Our results show that generally the Internet is now more popular than newspapers for news, although TV is still the most popular. Interestingly, when we asked where people got their news today, more people said newspapers than the Internet. Maybe this is because people read the news on the Internet on their lunch break at work, but read newspapers in the morning.
