GIRL: It's Harry's.

WOMAN: Which boy is he?

GIRL: He's the one at the far end of the table. He's eating some pizza.

*Can you see the line? This is an example.
Now you listen and draw lines.*

WOMAN: Who's that boy in the red T-shirt?

GIRL: That's Paul. He goes to my school.

WOMAN: Where's his paper hat?

GIRL: It's fallen on the floor, but he doesn't know it yet.

GIRL: Sarah looks happy, doesn't she?

WOMAN: Is she the little girl in the high chair?

GIRL: That's right. She's got a toy bear in her hand.

WOMAN: Yes, and there's ice cream on her face!

GIRL: Look at Sally!

WOMAN: She's whispering something, isn't she?

GIRL: No, I mean the other girl, the blonde one.

WOMAN: Oh, yes, I see. She's got a birthday present in her hands.

 GIRL: No, not her, I mean the girl. She's wearing a T-shirt with stripes.
 WOMAN: Oh, yes, I see her. She's carrying some glasses to the table.

GIRL: Look! That's my cousin Richard, near the door.
 WOMAN: I can't see his face.
 GIRL: No. He's going to turn the light off now.
 WOMAN: Then someone is going to cut the cake.
 GIRL: Yes, and they're all going to sing 'Happy Birthday'!
