What are possessive adjectives?



We use possessive adjectives to say that things belong to someone.

Subject	Possessive Adjective
I	my
you	your
he	his
she	her
it	its
we	our
they	their


There are many acronyms associated with English language teaching. These include (but are not limited to) ELT, TEFL, EFL, EAL and ESOL.
