Coordinating Conjunction

*For, And, Nor,
But, Or, Yet, So*

1. I chose that car as a birthday gift for my son.
2. Rambo and Charlie are good soldiers.
3. Angela is good at singing but poor at dancing.
4. The theme of tonight's party is yet to decide.

Subordinating Conjunction

*As, after, before,
even, than, that*

1. Because of the nonstop rain, we had to cancel our trip.
2. The stadium was looking like garbage after the match had finished.
3. I feared lest he said something inside?
4. The lawyer has provided the essential documents in the courtroom.

Correlative Conjunction

*Not only - but also,
either-or, not - but,*

1. She became a topper not only in the district but also in the state.
2. They can have either whiskey or wine at a party.
3. Both my brother and I are gamers.
4. Neither the shopkeeper nor my friend has this game set.

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
