First, if there are no seats, plan with your friends or family where to stand before you go. If you want to be near the stage, you'll need to arrive very early. This means several hours on your feet before the band appears. This can be both tiring and boring. I'd suggest you only do it for a band you really love.

What you wear is really important. Two things are sure: you're going to get hot and people will tread on your toes. This means you shouldn't wear anything too heavy except perhaps on your feet. Avoid sandals and wear trainers instead. You can look good and be comfortable at the same time. Don't take too much stuff or you'll get bored carrying it around. Think about the essential things you'll need. These include your ticket, some money and your phone. You can put these into your pocket or a small bag. Make sure everything is safe during the concert.

You'll want to take a phone or camera to take lots of photos. Make sure it has enough power and memory for the whole evening. Take a spare battery if you have one. It'll help you take all the photos you want to remember the event.

Finally, remember that people will dance around during the concert. This means you'll probably get pushed. If it's a lively band, the audience might go a bit crazy. If this isn't for you, move away. Stand near the back. You can still enjoy the concert from there. You'll have more space to dance too. Yes, dance. Above all, dance and have a great time!
