Complete each sentence using the correct form of the verb in parentheses.

Conditional Type	Explanation and Example
Zero Conditional	Used for general truths and facts. Structure: If + present simple, present simple Example: If you heat ice, it melts.
First Conditional	Used for real future possibilities. Structure: If + present simple, will + base verb Example: If it rains, we will stay inside.
Second Conditional	Used for unreal or hypothetical present/future situations. Structure: If + past simple, would + base verb Example: If I won the lottery, I would travel the world.
Third Conditional	Used for imaginary past situations and their results. Structure: If + past perfect, would have + past participle Example: If she had studied, she would have passed.
