

One summer, a local animal rescue center received an urgent call from a family who had been trimming their trees. They discovered a squirrel nest in one of the branches, which was cut down by accident, leaving behind five very young baby squirrels. The family was concerned about the well-being of the tiny creatures and reached out for help.

A dedicated volunteer from the center immediately took the babies into her care. Upon examining them, she found that one of the babies had a broken leg from the fall. 11 The origins of trains can be traced back to ancient times. One of the earliest known causeways, the Post Track, was built in England around 3838 B.C. In ancient Greece, people and animals pulled wheeled vehicles across grooves in limestone, guiding wagons along designated routes — a concept similar to modern railways. These early innovations laid the groundwork for what would eventually become the railway system. However, the true origins of the modern train began in the early 1800s with wooden rails in England. The first train was born from an argument between engineer Richard Trevithick and a mine owner in Penydarran, U.K., marking the start of intercity and intercontinental travel by rail.

12 The bus is one of the most widely used public transport vehicles, serving both urban and intercity routes. Depending on the type, buses can carry anywhere from 30 to 300 passengers. Common variations include double-decker buses, which offer additional capacity, articulated buses for larger loads, and smaller options like midibuses and minibuses. Intercity buses cater to longer distances. The evolution of buses began with horse-drawn versions in the 1820s, followed by steam buses in the 1830s and electric trolleybuses in 1882. The first motorized buses appeared in 1895. Today, reflecting global trends in sustainable transportation, there's a growing shift towards environmentally friendly options like hybrid electric, fuel cell, and compressed natural gas buses.

13 The metro is a high-capacity public transport system commonly found in urban areas, designed to efficiently move large crowds. Unlike buses or trams, metro systems typically operate on private railways that are inaccessible to pedestrians and other vehicles, often running through underground tunnels or high-speed lines. The London Underground, the world's oldest metro system, opened in 1863 and introduced its first electrified line in 1890. Today, the Shanghai Metro holds the title for the world's longest metro network, spanning 803 kilometers and boasting the highest annual ridership with 2.83 billion trips. Meanwhile, the New York City Subway has the most stations, with 472, and Mexico City operates the second largest metro system in North America.

14 A cable car is a unique transportation system where cabins are suspended from steel ropes, offering a thrilling ride to high places, whether in mountainous regions or cities. Unlike elevators, cable cars can reach great heights, crossing valleys much like helicopters. The Norsjö Cable Car in Sweden holds the title of the world's longest cable car line. Established in 1942, it stretches 13.2 kilometers (8.2 miles) between the settlements of Örtrask and Menstrask. The journey takes about 1.5 hours, providing spectacular views and a smooth ride through Sweden's scenic landscapes. Cable cars not only offer a practical solution for challenging terrains but also a breathtaking experience.

15 A ferry, or car ferry, is a versatile mode of transport used in seas or lakes to carry passengers and vehicles, including cars and even railway vehicles, across water. Unlike cruise ships, ferries serve a more practical purpose, similar to buses or trains, by providing essential transportation between cities, islands, and across bodies of water like the Western Mediterranean, Adriatic, and Baltic Sea. However, some ferries also cater to the leisure industry, transporting vacationers between destinations, such as from the UK to France or Spain, or among the Greek islands. These vessels offer a vital link for travelers and commuters alike, balancing utility with the occasional touch of adventure in regions rich with waterways.

16 Trams, a key component of rail systems, are known for carrying large numbers of passengers. They come in both high-speed and low-speed varieties, and unlike trains, tram rails can be laid on streets, allowing other vehicles to share the road. Most trams are powered by electricity, though horse or petrol-powered versions also exist. The evolution of electric trams is fascinating. The first street tramway appeared in New York in 1832, followed by New Orleans in 1835, where it still operates today. Electric trams became possible after Werner von Siemens developed a practical dynamo in 1879, leading to the world's first electric tramway in Berlin in 1881. By 1883, the United Kingdom had its first electric lines, including the still-operating Volks Railway in Brighton.
