- ¹ The expression—"everyone has a price"—means that everyone can be persuaded to do something dishonest or immoral, if they are offered a large enough amount of money.
- ² This is another common expression: "I wonder how he sleeps at night". It refers to a person's conscience keeping him or her awake because that person has done something dishonest or immoral.
- ³ The word *damn* is not a polite word. As a verb, it means to be condemned by God to suffer eternal punishment in hell. As an adjective, it is used for emphasis or to express anger or frustration.
- ⁴ The word *shades* is a slang expression for sunglasses. It comes from *shade*, meaning "shelter from direct sunlight".
- ⁵ A price tag is a label showing the price of an item.
- ⁶ *Cha-ching* is an example of onomatopoeia. Onomatopoeia is when a word is formed because of the sound associated with an idea or thing. A lot of bird names are onomatopoeic; for example, the cuckoo is named for the sound the bird makes. Other words that are onomatopoeic include: *boom* for the sound of an explosion and *honk* for the sound of a car horn. *Cha-ching* is the sound that old cash registers made when money was added to the machine.
- ⁷ A *low blow* is a comment or action that is unfair or unkind. The expression comes from boxing, where hitting an opponent below the belt is against the rules of the game.
- ⁸ I have to explain this word in person / in class, but don't use it. It is not a polite word.
