We use *a lot of* for a big number or amount.

We use *any* in negative statements and questions.

quantifier	noun	example
<b>some</b> a lot of	plural countable	Let's buy <b>some beans</b> .
	uncountable	You have <b>a lot of grapes</b> .
any	plural countable	I <b>can't</b> see <b>any potatoes</b> .
	uncountable	We <b>don't</b> have <b>any lemons</b> .

Can I have **some sugar**, please?

Would you like **something** to drink?
