Reading 2

The Missed Chance

Jessica had always dreamed of becoming a famous singer. When she was a teenager, she had the chance to audition for a popular music competition. Her friends and family encouraged her, and her best friend Amy said, "You should go for it, Jess! You might regret it if you don't." But Jessica was worried about her schoolwork. She told herself, "If I don't study hard, I won't get into university." So, she decided not to audition.

Years later, Jessica often remembered that opportunity. She imagined herself on stage, singing in front of thousands of people, wearing beautiful costumes, and traveling around the world. Sometimes she thought, "I could have been on stage. I might have won. I should have listened to Amy's advice." She also wondered how different her life might have been if she had taken the chance.

Now Jessica works in an office, and although she is happy with her career and friends, she sometimes feels a little sad. She knows she made a safe choice, but she also feels she lost a chance to follow her dream. "If I had tried, even if I had failed, I would have been proud of myself," she says. Her story reminds us that sometimes it is better to take risks than to always choose the safe road.
