

Remember what we are doing when we **CONJUGATE** verbs. We are saying **WHO** does the **ACTION** of the sentence. In Spanish, we use verb **INFINITIVES**. We remove the ending of the **INFINITIVE** and add endings that we have to **MEMORIZE**. Those endings represent different **SUBJECTS** that are doing the **ACTION** in the sentence. One thing is for sure, **CONJUGATION** in Spanish takes a great deal of **PRACTICE**!
