The Temple of Literature, just 10 minutes from Sword Lake, was built in 1070 under King Ly Thanh Tong. In 1076, King Ly Nhan Tong expanded it and established Quoc Tu Giam, the first university in Vietnam. The complex consists of five courtyards, each with its own meaning and history. There are 82 stone stelae, engraved with the names and hometowns of 1,307 doctors from 82 royal examinations held between 1442 and 1779.

Every year, especially at the beginning of the year or in May, students visit to rub the tortoise heads on the stelae for good luck before exams. The Temple is admired for its traditional Vietnamese architecture, made of wood and tiles, and its peaceful gardens. Ancient trees along the pathways have witnessed centuries of change. Today, the Temple of Literature is a symbol of knowledge, culture, and national pride, attracting thousands of visitors from Vietnam and abroad.

Chu Van An was born in 1292 in Van Thon village, Thanh Tri district, Hanoi. Known for his integrity, he passed the doctoral examination but refused to become a mandarin. Instead, he opened a school in Huynh Cung village and began teaching as a Confucian scholar. Under King Tran Minh Tong, he taught at the Imperial Academy, responsible for educating Crown Prince Vuong, later Emperor Tran Hien Tong.

Later, Chu Van An resigned and returned home after King Tran Du Tong rejected his request to punish eight corrupt mandarins. He spent the rest of his life teaching and writing books, remaining devoted to education. He died of illness in 1370.

After his death, an altar was built in his honor at the Temple of Literature, where he is remembered as a symbol of integrity, dedication, and learning in Vietnamese history.
