

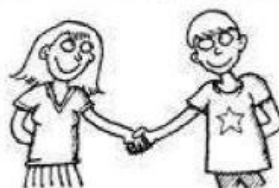

- 3 I've lost my cheque book and credit cards.



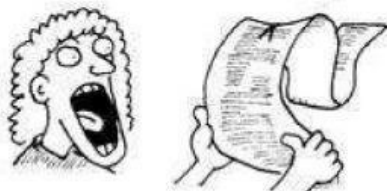
- 4 Keith wants to drive home, but he hasn't got his glasses.



- 5 My tooth hurts.



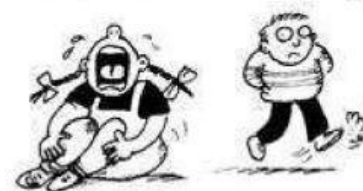
- 6 There's a hole in my shoe. I only bought them last week!
