Look at the words in the sentences. What are they in Swedish?

Note: You will need to defer to the Swedish grammar rules when you write the right form in Swedish: a boy = en pojke; the boy = pojken; the house = huset (You may use <https://bab.la/> if you want to, but forget Google Translate!)

angry (adj)

There were a lot of angry people marching down the street, demonstrating for peace.



beach (n)

When we were on the beach, the children played with the sand.

bird (n)

Jenny sees a big bird flying and carrying grass in its mouth.

clean (adj)

Per washed his hair this morning. Now it is clean.

coconut (n)

My father bought two coconuts in the market today!

cook (n)

She is a cook at a restaurant in Leeds.

cook (v)

What will you cook for supper? I am hungry!

finish (v)

I did not have a chance to finish my letter yesterday, so I must continue writing today.

ground (n)

In the autumn all leaves turn orange and fall to the ground.

island (n)

Ösel is an island located in the Baltic sea. It belongs to Estonia.

market (n)

There is a market outside the Nobel Museum.

pair of trousers (n)

When it is cold outside, I prefer to wear a pair of trousers.

pull (v)

If anyone is in danger, you have to pull the handle.

question (n)

I want you to ask many questions today.

river (n)

May I go to the river? I want to go fishing with my friend.

roof (n)

Nobody likes a house with holes in the roof.

thief (n)

My TV was stolen yesterday. A thief came when I was working.

tired (adj)

Anna is so tired. She has slept too little lately.

watch (n)

Have you seen my watch? I can't find it!

weak (adj)

After a long time of sickness, you are often very weak.

well (adj)

When you have recovered from a sickness, you are well again.
