Grammar Refresh

- **must / mustn't**: express strong obligation or prohibition. (You must study. / You mustn't cheat.)
- **have to / don't have to**: express necessity or lack of necessity. (I have to wear a uniform. / You don't have to bring food.)
- **will**: future predictions or quick decisions. (I will call you tomorrow.)
- **won't**: negative form of will, for refusals or negative predictions. (I won't go to the party.)
- **going to**: future plans and intentions, or when there is present evidence. (I'm going to study medicine. / Look at those clouds – it's going to rain.)
- **Zero conditional**: facts and routines. (If you heat ice, it melts.)
- **First conditional**: real future possibilities. (If it rains, we will stay home.)
- **Present Perfect**: experiences or actions with present relevance. (I have visited London.)
- **Past Simple**: completed past actions. (I visited London last year.)
