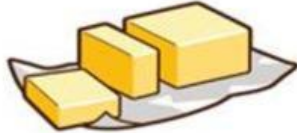

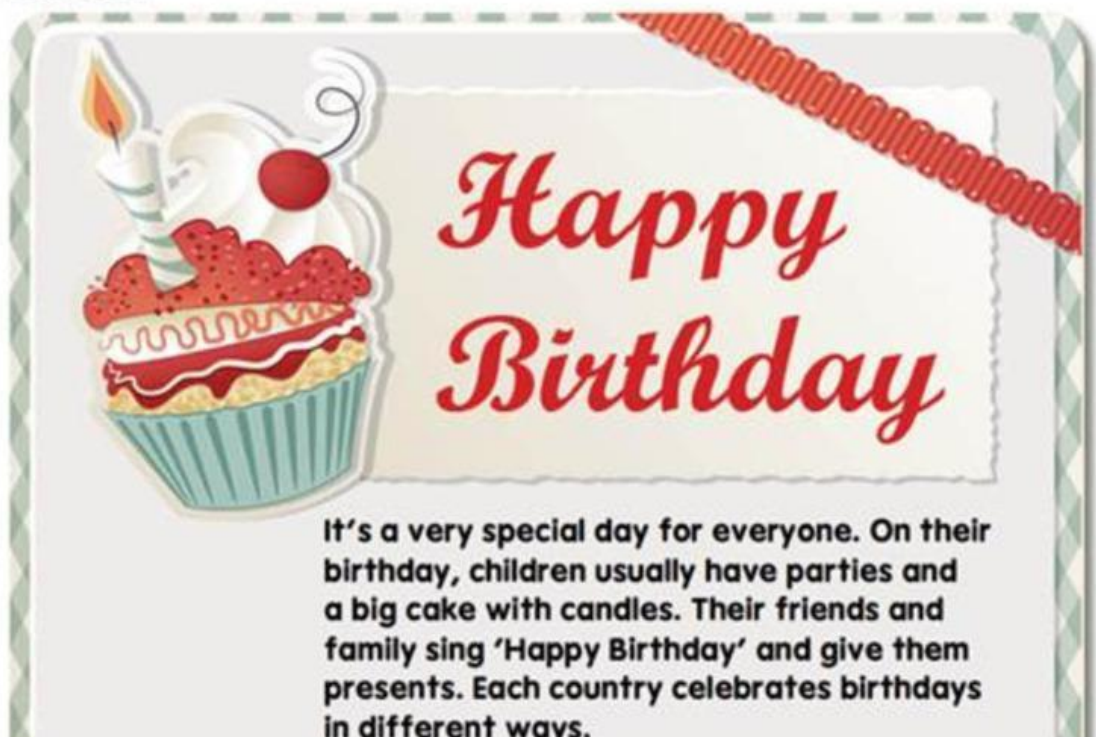

In Canada friends and family put butter on the child's nose for good luck.



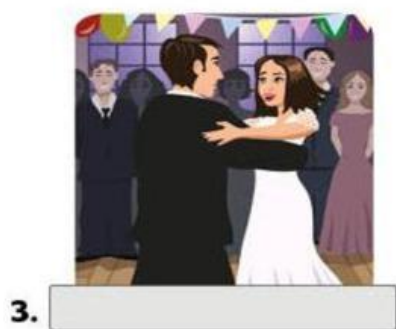
In the Netherlands children give sweets to their classmates. The teacher also makes a birthday hat for the birthday child.
