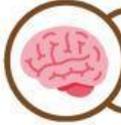

Narrative text is a type of text that tells a series of events in a chronological and generally imaginative.

### The Social Function of Narrative Text

- a. to tell stories or past events to entertain the readers

## Let's Read!

### Generic Structure of Narrative Text

1

#### Orientation

The orientation provides essential background information to help the reader understand the context of the story. It answers basic questions like who, what, where, and when.

2

#### Complication

This part of the narrative introduces the main problem or conflict that the characters must face. The complication creates tension or challenges, pushing the story forward. It's where the problem or event disrupts the normal situation, prompting action or change.

3

#### Resolution

This part shows how the conflict is solved, whether through the characters' actions, decisions, or other events.

4

#### Re-Orientation

This part reflects on the changes that have occurred in the story, how the characters have learned or grown, or how life has returned to normal after the events. It may also give the reader a moral or lesson learned from the story.
