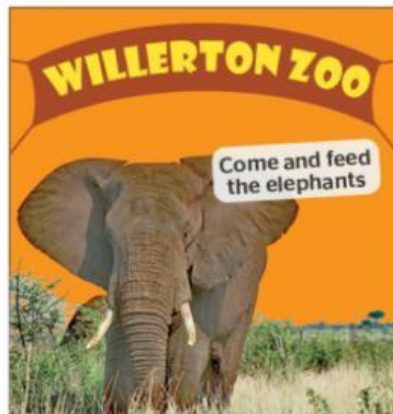

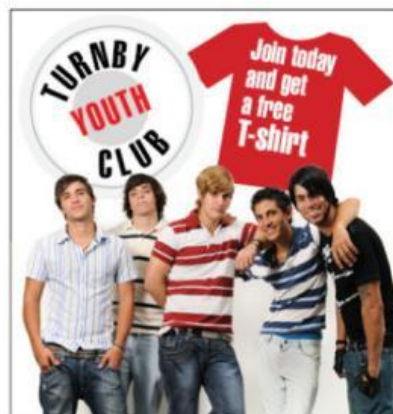

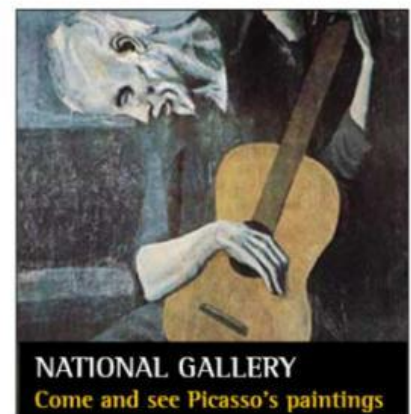

► Conditional Sentences Type 1

We use **Conditional Sentences Type 1** for something which is likely to happen in the present or future.

IF-CLAUSE

If+Present Simple

MAIN CLAUSE

Future *will*

Modal Verbs (can, may, might, must)

Imperative

If I like the car, I'll buy it.

If you want to get into the museum, you must buy a ticket.

If you don't feel well, go to bed.

NOTE:

- We can use **unless** instead of **if... not**.
We'll go shopping unless it rains.
(=We'll go shopping if it doesn't rain.)
- When the **if-clause** comes before the **main clause**, the two clauses are separated by a **comma**.

► Time Clauses (Present - Future)

- Time clauses begin with **when, after, before, as soon as, until**, etc.
- When the sentence refers to the present or future, we usually use the Present Simple in the time clause and the Future *will* in the main clause.

TIME CLAUSE

As soon as I know,

Before I leave,

MAIN CLAUSE

I'll tell you.

I'll help you with your project.

NOTE:

- When the time clause comes before the main clause, the two clauses are separated by a comma.
