Protecting the environment doesn't always require big actions. In fact, small everyday choices made by people in a local community can have a big impact. Whether it's picking up litter, planting trees, or saving water, each action helps improve the place we live. One major problem in many towns is plastic waste. When plastic bags and bottles end up on sidewalks or in rivers, they pollute nature and **harm** animals. Local clean-up events organized by schools or community groups can help reduce this problem.
