When do we use the passive voice?

1. When the agent (the person who does the action) is unknown, obvious, or unimportant.

- My wallet was stolen. (We don't know who did it.)
- The thief was arrested. (It's obvious the police did it.)

2. When we want to emphasize the action or the recipient of the action.

- The new library will be opened by the Queen. (The focus is on the library and the event.)

3. In formal or scientific writing.

- The solution was heated to 100°C.

Structure:

[Object] + [be] + [Past Participle of Main Verb] + (by [Agent])
