We Use “the” ...

1. When there is **only one** or **it's obvious** what we mean:

1. *the map* (the one on your phone)
2. *the hotel app* (a specific tool you're using)

2. When we **already know** or have **mentioned it**:

1. *I opened the translator. The app was very helpful.*

3. With **superlatives** or **specific groups**:

1. *the best travel apps*
2. *the most popular destinations*



We DON'T Use “the” ...

1. When we speak **in general**:

1. *Apps help tourists every day.*
2. *People use technology more now.*

2. With **uncountable nouns** or **plural nouns used generally**:

1. *Travelers need information.*
2. *I like apps that work offline.*

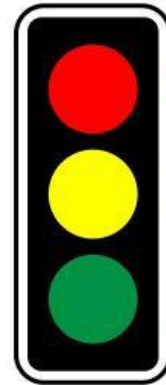
