The Wright Brothers

Today, people fly all over the world and astronauts (1) even flown into space and landed on the moon. But (2) you know that human flight began with two brothers called Wilbur and Orville Wright? Born in Dayton, Ohio, USA in the 1870s, Wilbur and Orville were two of seven siblings. The brothers got (3) very well with each other, so they liked hanging (4) together in their free time. When they were young, Wilbur and Orville (5) often build things together, and their great dream was to build a flying machine that they could both fly in.

In 1893, they opened a bicycle shop and used the money they earned to pay for experiments with the flying machines they used (6) build. After 10 years, they finally figured (7) how to get their machines to fly and on 17 December 1903, Orville made the first successful flight, flying 36 metres through the air in 12 seconds.
