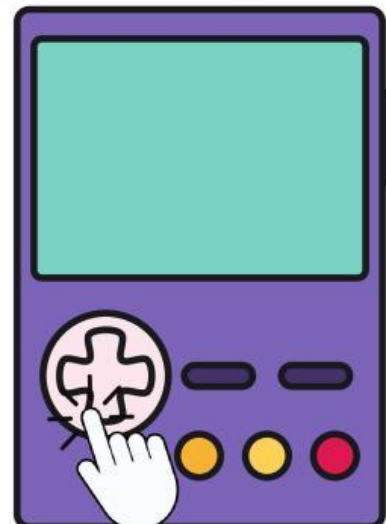

Story Comic Project: Step-by-Step Guide

Step 1 – Plan Your Story

- Think of your idea. Decide the title, main characters, setting, and the plot (beginning, problem, ending).

 Example: A boy finds a magic key that opens a secret door.

Step 2 – Write a Draft Story

- Write in 3 parts:
 - Orientation: Who, where, when
 - Complication: What problem happens
 - Resolution: How the problem is solved
- Keep it short – about 6–8 sentences.

Step 3 – Divide Into Panels

- Split your story into 6–8 boxes (comic panels).
- Each box shows one moment or event.

Step 4 – Add Illustrations

- Draw the characters and setting in each box.
- Show the actions clearly.
- You can draw on paper manually or digitally (for example using Kana, Canva, or other apps).

Step 5 – Add Captions

- Under each box, write 1–2 sentences that explain what's happening.

Example:

 Box 1 → Emily finds a shiny key in her garden.

 Box 2 → She wonders what the key can open.

Step 6 – Add Speech Bubbles (Optional)

- Write short dialogue with correct punctuation and polite expressions.

Example: "What is this key for?" asked Emily.

Step 7 – Check and Revise

- Make sure your comic has a clear beginning, middle, and ending.
- Fix grammar and spelling.
- Check that every picture matches the text.

Step 8 – Share Your Comic

- Present it to the class and explain your story.
- Submit it digitally.
