Canidae is a family of dogs, but some scientists think that dogs actually have ancestry from other animals. The jackals, coyotes, and foxes fall into this category. The majority of scientists also think that the variation was shaped by natural selection and evolution. In subsequent epochs, dog breeders sought out dogs that people liked and crossed them to create new varieties. Most of the time, the Hawaiian Islands make us think of a busy tourist spot with white sand beaches and palm trees. On one of the farthest northern islands, though, there aren't any guests or vacation activities. Niihau Island has a volcano that is no longer active, a fragile swamp, and lush woods. There are also many rare animals that live there, like the Hawaiian monk seal. The Robinson family bought the island from the King of Hawaii in 1864 with the promise that they would protect the original Hawaiian culture and language by living there. To keep this promise, the family started to curb the number of people who could visit the island over time. Today, you can only talk to the original Niihauans on the island if they invite you. Because of this, the locals didn't know much about the rest of the world until lately.

The main town of the island looks like it has been frozen in time when you walk through **it**. There aren't any cars, stores, bars, or cops. Horses and bicycles are the only ways to get around. There is no electricity, running water, or phone lines. The 130 people who live there **permanently** are all native Hawaiians and speak Hawaiian as their first language. They fish and farm for a living and don't pay rent. People who live on the other Hawaiian islands have very different ways of life.

The kids in Niihau don't have TVs or electronics like other kids, but they go to a small school that gets all of its power from the sun. The school is one of only a few in the US that gets all of its power from the sun. Hawaiian traditions and ideals about living off the land and ocean are taught at the school. At the same time, the kids can learn how to use computers and meet with people from other places.

People from other places can connect with Niihau by buying the islanders' items, like jewelry made from shells. In other places, you can buy these things. Few people are able to visit this **banned** land, but tourists are still interested in its secrets.

A food reviewer is a paid writer who writes about the food they try. People who do this job may also be known as food writers or restaurant reviewers. Food reviewers usually write about what they eat after going to different places and ordering different kinds of food. Some people write about food for websites, blogs, newspapers, and magazines. But not all jobs in this field pay well, or at all. Food writers who are just starting out might send in reviews for free at first just to get their name on the paper and show that **they** have written something. Some people become food reviewers by writing about the food they eat and where they eat on social media.

They can try new foods anywhere in the world. A few of these **experts** have their own TV shows. People who know a lot about food can also write books about it. There aren't many paid openings for this highly sought-after job. People who want this job will have to work hard and spend a lot of time on it.

Content writers make \$17.54 an hour.

Pay ranges from \$7.25 to \$74.45 an hour.

News reporters, staff writers, and content writers, whose jobs are a lot like food reviews, can find information here. A lot of people who review food don't always write about it. A baby born today will live for how long? 100 years? 120 years? Genes that could make us all live longer are being studied by scientists.

100 years old is already an important milestone for a **huge** number of people. They are called "wellderly" because there are so many healthy older people. Not having a big sickness like high blood pressure, heart disease, or diabetes makes this group of people over 80 years old.

In places where good old age is common, there are a lot of research studies. The island of Okinawa in Japan and Calabria in the south of Italy are two examples. About 2,000 people are living in the small village of Molochio in Calabria. Plus, at least eight of them are over 100 years old. "I eat a lot of fruit and vegetables" is the answer that experts always get from people like this when they are asked how they stay so healthy and young. "Something from every food group." "I don't drink or smoke."

Today, experts are also looking at genes to try to figure out why some people live so long. In the past, they only looked at things like food and lifestyle. Eric Topol, a researcher, says that we must have genes that keep us from getting old. People who share a DNA link were looked at in the new study on living a long time. Living in Ecuador is a cool group. There are several people in one part of the country who all have the same genetic situation. Laron disease is the name for **it**. Not very tall—just over a meter—these guys get. They are also less likely to get cancer and diabetes because they have Laron syndrome. Their family members live shorter lives because of this. Additionally, there is a group of long-living Japanese-American guys on the Hawaiian island of Oahu. In the Laron syndrome group, they share a gene.

The family trees of the 100-year-old people were made by researchers back in Calabria. Family records from the 1800s to the present day were looked at. To sum up, DNA factors that are good for men's health have been found. Most of the time, women in Europe live longer than men, so this finding is **strange**. Why do some people live longer? Probably a third factor—luck—comes into play along with genes and the surroundings.
