# PRESENT SIMPLE VS CONTINUOUS – FORM

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## PRESENT SIMPLE

POSITIVE

I/You/We/They **work**

He/She/It

NEGATIVE

I/You/We/They **don't**

He/She/It  **work**

QUESTION

**I/you/we/they**  **he/she/it**  **?**

SHORT ANSWER

**Yes,** **I/you/we/they** **do** **he/she/it**

**No,** **I/you/we/they**  **he/she/it**

## PRESENT CONTINUOUS

POSITIVE

I  **working**

You/We/They **are**

He/She/It

NEGATIVE

I'm **not** **working**

You/We/They

He/She/It  **working**

QUESTION

**I**  **you/we/they**  **he/she/it**  **?**

SHORT ANSWER

**Yes,** **I** **am** **You/We/They** **are** **He/She/It** **is**

**No,** **I**  **You/We/They**  **He/She/It**

-ING SPELLING

work  
study → working

live  
make → making

run  
swim → running

GENERAL RULE: add **-ing**

Consonant + **-e** : delete **-e** and add **-ing**

Consonant + vowel + consonant (stressed):  
double the consonant + **-ing**
