### St. Nicholas Day Traditions of Celebration

Every year **on December 6th**, people in many European countries celebrate St. Nicholas Day. The holiday is dedicated to Saint Nicholas of Myra, a kind and generous bishop who lived in the 4th century. He became famous for helping the poor, **protecting children, and performing miracles.**

According to legend, St. Nicholas secretly left **gold coins for people in need.** This is how the tradition of **gift-giving** began. Today, children clean their shoes or hang stockings by the window or fireplace on the evening of December 5th. During the night, St. Nicholas visits and fills them with **sweets, chocolate coins, and small presents** — but only for those who behaved well during the year!

In Ukraine, children also look forward to Saint Mykolai's Day. Parents often **hide gifts under the pillow**, and in schools, pupils prepare songs, poems, and performances about kindness and generosity. The holiday reminds everyone to be helpful and caring towards others.

In some other countries, like Germany, Poland, and the Netherlands, people celebrate with **parades, fairs, and festive food.** St. Nicholas sometimes arrives on a white horse or in a boat, accompanied by helpers who check if children were good or naughty.

Although every country has its own traditions, the message of St. Nicholas Day is the same everywhere — **to share joy, kindness, and love.**


