They enjoy tasks that allow them to express themselves and mix with people. Job matches: actor, art therapist, graphic designer, writer.

• *Social*: Social personalities love to work with people. They get the most satisfaction out of teaching and helping others, and are driven to serve the community as opposed to making money. Job matches: coach, counselor, social worker, teacher.

• *Enterprising*: Many great leaders and business people have enterprising personalities. These are persuasive people who are good at making decisions and leading teams. They tend to value money, power, and status, and will work

toward achieving them. Job matches: business owner, event manager, lawyer, salesperson.

• *Conventional*: Conventional people appreciate rules and regulations, and like having structure to their lives. They are logical thinkers and have a lot of self-control. Job matches: accountant, analyst, editor, librarian.
