GRAMMAR CHECKS: THE PAST

There are about 100 English past irregular verbs in the affirmative. The verb changes from the base verb except when it is in the negative!

I SAW A GHOST.

There are questions about OBJECTS in the past, where the verb does not change:

WHO DID YOU SEE? I SAW GEORGE.

WHERE DID YOU GO? I WENT HOME.

WHY DID HE DO THAT? HE DID IT FOR MONEY.

HOW DID YOU SLEEP LAST NIGHT? I SLEPT WELL.

I DIDN'T SEE A GHOST.

There are questions about SUBJECTS in the past, where the verb does change:

WHO CAME TO THE PARTY? BILL CAME TO THE PARTY.

WHO DID THIS? SUSAN DID THIS.

WHO BOUGHT THIS? JILL BOUGHT IT.
