People usually <sup>4</sup>empty/charge their mobile phones and laptops all night, but this is a waste of electricity. These gadgets only need a few hours.

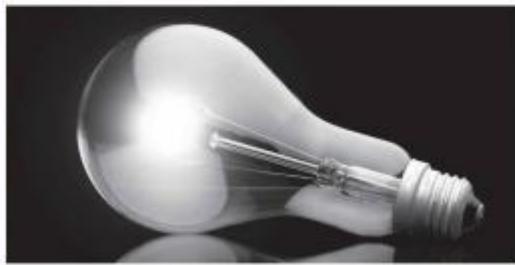
**Tip 4**
