WILL LIFE BE WORTH LIVING IN 2035 AD?

What sort of life will you be living 74 years from now? Scientists have looked into the future and they can tell you.

You will be transported to work in monorail vehicles at 200 miles an hour. Your house will probably have air walls, and a floating roof, adjustable to the angle of the sun. Doors will open automatically. People will build the heating and cooling systems into the furniture and carpets.

You will have a home control room – an electronics centre, where messages will be recorded when you're not at home. This will play back when you return, and also give you up-to-minute world news. You will have wall-to-wall TV, an indoor swimming pool and TV-telephones.

The status symbol of the year 2035 will be the home robot help, which will help parents to take care of the children, and cook the meals. Cooking will be done in solar ovens with microwave controls.

Food won't be very different from 1961, but there will be a few new dishes for example instant bread, sugar made of sawdust, and synthetic tea. Energy will come in tablet form.

At work, parents will operate on a 20 hour week. Because of that, parents will have more time for each other and they will also be able to spend more time with their children. The offices will be air-conditioned with stimulating scents and extra oxygen. There will be machines that will do the work of clerks, shorthand writers and translators.

The family cars will be soundless. The engine will be smaller than a typewriter. Railways will have one central dispatcher, who will control a whole nation's traffic. Jet trains will be guided by electronic brains.

James Cook' parents (1) _____ English farm workers. But James Cook (2) _____ of being a sailor. In 1741, aged 13, he left home to work in the port of Whitby. For thirteen years, he sailed on colliers, ships that transported coal. Then he (3) _____ the Royal Navy.

James Cook was a good sailor. He was interested in astronomy and (4) _____ very accurate maps of the sea. His leaders gave him a very important mission - to discover new land and carry out scientific research in the Pacific Ocean.

James Cook made his first journey between 1768 and 1771. He bought a ship called the Endeavour. He discovered the Society Islands, New Zealand and the east coast of Australia. He was the first European to see a kangaroo. He (5) _____ it was a type of a large dog.

In 1772 James Cook (6) _____ sail again for the Pacific to find a southern continent. At that time people believed it was a continent where rivers flowed with gold. But all Cook (7) _____ was ice. This was Antarctica.

Cook made sure his sailors stayed healthy at sea. He made them eat fruit, cabbage and vegetables that were full of vitamins to fight scurvy. It was caused by a lack of vitamin C and could be fatal. Between 1776 and 1779, Cook went in search of the Northwest Passage, a sea route between the Atlantic and the Pacific. But the ice stopped him and he (8) _____ turn round to go back. He died in Hawaii in a fight with local people.
