

Identifying Nouns: Grade 4 English Worksheet

Understanding Nouns

Reading Passage: Nouns are words that name people, places, things, or ideas. They can be common nouns, which are general names like "city" or "dog," or proper nouns, which are specific names like "New York" or "Fido." Nouns can also be singular, referring to one item, or plural, referring to more than one. Understanding nouns is essential for building strong sentences.
