Starting at the age of 14, my cousin Laura Dekker went on a journey to sail on her own around the world. She had the help of her parents but all other people in her country did everything they could to stop her. However, Laura completed her journey when she was 16 years old, which made her the youngest person to ever sail around the world on her own.

Laura was born on September 20th, in 1995, in New Zealand, during a 7-year sailing trip by her parents. As a family, they travelled for another 5 years before returning to Holland. At the age of 10 she bought her first boat from money that she earned by doing all kinds of different jobs. She sailed this boat alone around Holland and the North Sea. 
Three cities to live in
