Dodo, the Long-Nosed Monkey at Gembira Loka Zoo



Dodo is a **long-nosed** monkey that **lives** at Gembira Loka Zoo in Yogyakarta, Indonesia. He is about ten years old and one of the most **famous** animals in the zoo. Visitors often **stop** to **watch** his **funny** expressions and his **long, hanging** nose, which **makes** him **look** both **strange** and **adorable**. His **thick, reddish-brown** fur **shines** under the sunlight, and his **long tail** **helps** him **balance** as he **moves** from branch to branch. Dodo's enclosure is **large** and full of **green** **trees**, climbing ropes, and a **small** pond where he **likes** to **play**. Sometimes, he sits **quietly** on the **highest** branch, **looking** around with **curious** eyes at the people **passing** by.

Dodo **has** many **interesting** habits and **unique** physical features. His webbed hands and feet **make** him an **excellent** swimmer, and he often **dives** into the pond to **cool** himself on **hot** days. During feeding time, he **enjoys eating** bananas, **young** leaves, and seeds. **Because of** his **special** four-part stomach, he **can digest** **tough** **food** like leaves and **unripe** fruits. Sometimes, he **chews** his food, **spits** it out, and **chews** it again before **swallowing** it. After eating, Dodo usually **rests** on a tree branch, **closing** his eyes as if he **is smiling**. His **big** **belly** **helps** him **digest** food slowly, and his **loud** calls **can** sometimes **be heard** from far away, especially when he is **excited** or **calling** to other monkeys.

Dodo is **calm**, **gentle**, and **friendly**. He **likes** to **sit** close to other monkeys and rarely **fights** with them. When he sees familiar zookeepers, he sometimes **claps** his hands or **tilts** his head as if **greeting** them. He **enjoys hearing** the laughter of children who **visit** his enclosure, though he **doesn't like** sudden, **loud** noises. At night, Dodo **climbs** to the **highest** tree in his enclosure to **sleep** safely. Many visitors **call** him the "**funny-nosed** king" of Gembira Loka Zoo **because of** his **charming** appearance and **playful** **behavior**. Dodo is truly a **special** animal that **brings** happiness to everyone who **sees** him and **reminds** people how **wonderful** and **unique** Indonesia's **wildlife** can **be**.
