


The maps show changes that took place in Youngsville in New Zealand over a 25 year period from 1980 to 2005.

The maps (1) _____ the developments which took place in the coastal town of Youngsville between 1980 and 2005.

Overall, a comparison of the two maps reveals a complete transformation from a largely (2) _____ to a mainly urban area.

In the year 1980, the town was a much greener residential area with a large number of trees and individual houses, but during the next 25 years, the town (3) _____ a number of significant (4) _____. The most noticeable is that all of the trees in the south of the River Alanah were (5) _____ down, with all the houses along the railway line being demolished to (6) _____ for skyscrapers. Moreover, a new (7) _____ zone with warehouses and factories sprang up around the school and airport.

In contrast, only a few trees in the north of the river remained. The woodland was cleared and (8) _____ into a golf course, a park, and car parking facilities. Further developments were the construction of a stadium next to the north-east corner of the lake and the (9) _____ of the railway line from the river running directly to the north. A marina was also constructed at the mouth of the (10) _____.
