


Grammar Focus

+ **There is / There are**

There is + singular noun → one thing is present.

Example: There is a book on the desk.



There are + plural noun → more than one thing is present.

Example: There are three posters on the wall.

- **Negative**

There isn't a dictionary on my desk.

There aren't any pencils in my pencil case.

? **Questions**

Is there a bin in the class? – Yes, there is. / No, there isn't.

Are there any notebooks on the desk? – Yes, there are. / No, there aren't.

Grammar Focus

+ Simple Present Tense

We use it for routines, timetables, and daily life.

We / You / They + verb → We play football.

He / She / It + verb + -s/-es → She likes English.


Examples:

- We have a science lesson every Friday. ■ Our lessons start at nine o'clock.
- I go to school at nine o'clock. ■ He likes drama and art.

? Wh-Questions with "What time...?"

What time + do + we / you / they + verb ...?

What time + does + he / she / it + verb ...?

Examples:

- What time does the art lesson finish? ■ What time do you have lunch?
- What time does the Science lesson start? ■ What time do you tidy up your desk?
