Task Two. What does the sentence mean? Read and choose A or B.

B. I stayed longer even though the company didn't pay overtime.

2. **"If she had checked her email, she would have seen the schedule change."**

A. She didn't see the schedule change because she didn't check her email.  
B. She saw the schedule change without checking her email.

3. **"If they had offered me the position, I would have accepted it."**

A. I accepted the position even though they didn't offer it to me.  
B. I didn't accept the position because they didn't offer it to me.

4. **"If we had more staff, we would have opened a second branch."**

A. We didn't open a second branch because we didn't have enough staff.
