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Difficulty sleeping

As an international party DJ, I spend much of the time in the air, travelling from one nightclub to another to play music. Although it might sound really glamorous, coping with jet lag is a battle for me. To make matters worse, I don't have a nine to five job. In my case, I might go on stage at 1 a.m. and could be playing dance music until six in the morning. Of course, by the time I've packed up, I might not get back to my hotel until 9 a.m. On a few occasions, I haven't even had time to go to bed because I've had to get to the airport to catch a flight. I sleep whenever I can because I need plenty of energy for my gigs, but in my line of work that's easier said than done.

2 Paolo —

I've always loved my sleep and before we had the kids, I'd always have huge lie-ins on a Sunday morning. That's all changed now of course. My son, the oldest, is three and my daughter is only eight months and they won't be letting me have a lie-in any time soon. The youngest one still doesn't sleep through the night and my wife will get up a couple of times to feed her. She'll usually settle down at around six o'clock but that's around the time my son wakes up. That's also my alarm call because, even though I'm not working at the moment, someone has to give him his breakfast and look after him. As my wife's usually had to get up in the night, I don't have much choice!

I'm pretty used to getting up early in the mornings because I have to be at school by half past eight. Even

so, I don't think that being an early riser is good for me, as I just get tired during the day. That said, I still struggle to get to sleep in the evenings and I often stay up late. My mum's always telling me to go to bed earlier but what's the point if I won't be able to sleep? I think the answer is for school to start later in the mornings. I don't know any teenagers who'd have a problem with that.

I can't see myself sticking at this for too long.
