Sowing and Reaping Kindness

This story took place in Scotland. Alex was walking by the lake when suddenly he heard cries for help. A young man was struggling in a patch of floating mud. The harder he tried to escape, the deeper his body sank into the swampy water. Bravely, Alex, who was the son of a farmer and used to fighting against the forces of nature, jumped into the lake to save the young man. When Alex later accompanied the young man to his home, he was astonished to find out that the young man was the son of a nobleman.

A short while later, the young man's father came to see the farmer and offered him a large amount of money as a reward for saving his son's life. However, the farmer refused the offer. Still, the nobleman insisted on finding another way to repay the kindness. Finally, the farmer gladly accepted the nobleman's offer to provide his son with an education at St. Mary's Medical School in London. As a result, Alex completed his studies and eventually earned the title of doctor.

But the story did not end there. Around the same time, the nobleman's son joined the military. During the war, he was badly wounded and developed a severe fever due to infection. His condition began to improve only after he was given penicillin, the very medicine discovered by the same farmer's son, Dr. Alexander Fleming.



Just like what happened by the lake years before, the nobleman's son was saved once again by the same man. The young nobleman later became the legendary Prime Minister of Great Britain, Winston Churchill. Prime Minister Churchill later appointed Alexander Fleming, the farmer's son, as the Minister of Health of the United Kingdom.

The story of Fleming and Churchill was written by Arthur Gladstone Keeney (1893–1955) in his book Dr. Lifesaver. Keeney was a journalist who worked at the War Information Office in Florida and Washington, D.C., during World War II. Whether or not this story is historically accurate, the tale of Fleming and Churchill has inspired many people around the world. Whatever we do for others and for nature will surely come back to us, perhaps immediately, or perhaps in another form and at another time.

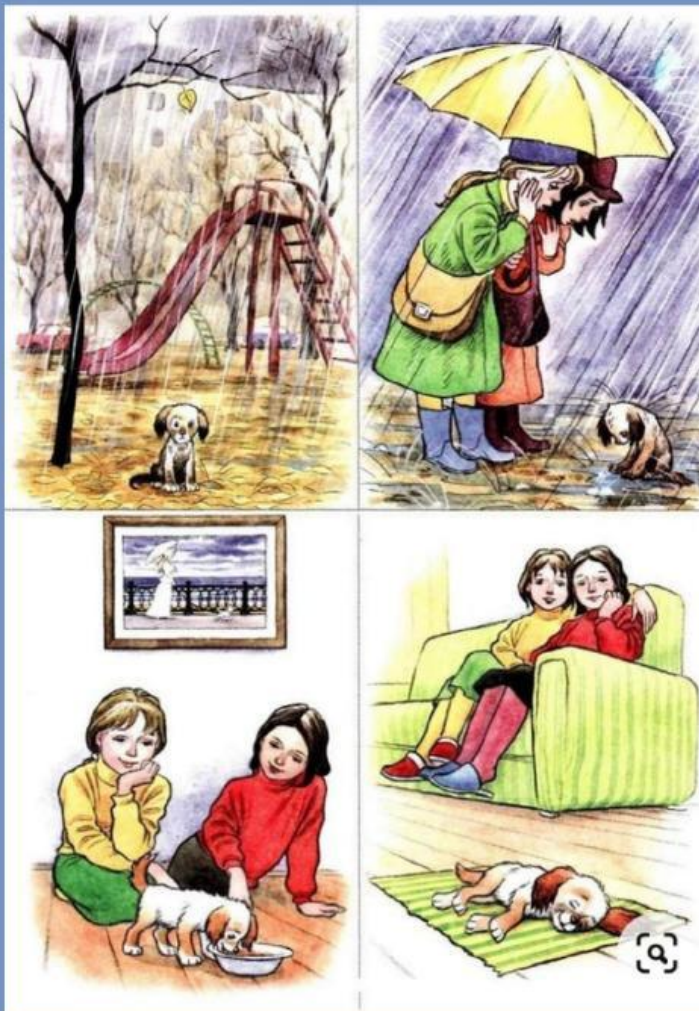
