The First Thanksgiving

The story of Thanksgiving began in 1620. The Pilgrims travelled from England to America on a ship called the Mayflower. Their first winter was very hard. Many people were cold and hungry. In the spring, the Native Americans from the Wampanoag tribe helped the Pilgrims. They taught them how to plant corn, how to fish, and how to survive in the new land. Thanks to this help, the Pilgrims had a good harvest in 1621.

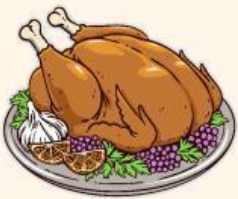
