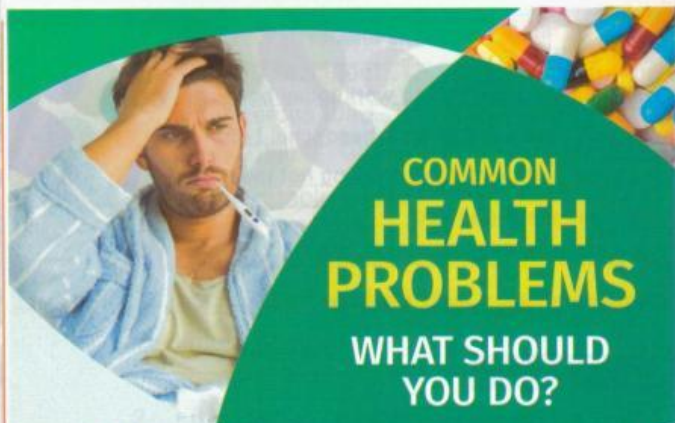

### HIGH TEMPERATURE

A temperature of over 38° Celsius is a high temperature. A person with a high temperature sometimes has got a headache, feels hot and cold or has got body pains. Help him to feel comfortable and give him a cool drink. He should also take medicine to help the pain. (Remember – you mustn't give aspirin to anyone under the age of 16, without a doctor's advice.)

### HEADACHES

You can help a headache with ordinary medicines, such as paracetamol. Occasionally, a person can also have a high temperature, feel confused or have difficulty seeing or moving their arms or legs. In such a situation, the person must get immediate medical attention.

### ASTHMA ATTACK

If a person has difficulty breathing and has got a bad cough, it is possible that he is having an asthma attack. Sometimes, it is hard for him to walk or talk. The person should sit down and take his medication. You should also make sure he is calm. In case of a severe attack, the person must get immediate medical attention.
