BEAR COUNTRY

INFO:

Welcome to our park! It is one of the biggest parks in the area and you can see many animals here. Some animals are quite timid and hide when they see or smell people. Others sometimes want to find out more about you. Usually the animals won't attack, but bears can be more dangerous than other animals. Here are some tips for a safe visit.

TIPS:

- Bears do not usually like to be near people, so hike in groups. Groups of people are noisier and smellier than one person. Talk or sing so that the bears will know you are there.
- If a bear comes near you, speak to it quietly and do not move suddenly. It's possible it is just curious and will leave.
- Do not run – a bear is faster than most people think.
- Do not climb a tree – both black bears and brown bears can climb trees.
- Remember – bears are hardly ever aggressive, so try to stay calm.
